Call for Workshop and Tutorial Proposals

Following the success of previous editions, FPL 2021 will host several workshops and tutorials on **August 30 until August 31, 2021**. We are soliciting proposals for new and recurring events to be organized within FPL 2021. **Workshops** provide excellent opportunities to bring together researchers and practitioners from different communities to share their experiences in an interactive atmosphere, and to foster collaboration for new and innovative projects. Organizers can choose between invited presentations (to be listed at the time of submission), open call for papers, or a combination of both. Other forms of interaction with the audience such as panels, demos and posters are of course welcome. Timely **tutorials** offer a unique opportunity for presenters to interact closely with attendees and for attendees to gain in-depth knowledge on a specific topic. Tutorials can be organized in lecture-style or as hands-on session.

We invite submissions for workshops and tutorials that focus on innovative and original ideas related to the core topics of FPL (Architectures and Technology, Applications and Benchmarks, Design Methods and Tools, Self-aware and Adaptive Systems, and Trends in Education) before the deadline of **May 10, 2021**. Proposals will be assessed and reviewed quickly, on a First-Come-First-Served basis, to give enough time and resources for the organization. This gives time for workshop organizers to attract high-quality submissions and for tutorial organizers to start preparing the material. Early submissions are thus encouraged and will likely receive a notification within a couple of weeks.

Workshop organizers with open call for papers are responsible for advertising, and setting up the submission, review, and camera-ready management processes. The organizers must also indicate what their expectation for the workshop is in terms of submitted and accepted papers. Workshop organizers are free to arrange the

publication of their workshop papers independently. FPL 2021 does not provide workshop proceedings, but will consider including the workshop papers on the website, as long as the workshop organizers can provide their final papers in time.

Requirements for workshop proposals

Please submit a PDF file (2 pages max, excluding biographies and references), containing the following information:

- A title for the workshop.
- A description of the topics and specific issues that the workshop will address, how the workshop complements FPL 2021, and why the workshop theme is relevant.
- Expected format of the workshop (regular-paper presentations, poster presentations, invited talks, panel discussions, demo sessions, or other ideas to promote active exchange of ideas).
- List of organizers including their short biographies, affiliation, and their expertise in the proposed topic(s).
- (preliminary) Program committee, if applicable.
- In case the workshop has been previously held, provide information to show that the previous edition(s) were successful in terms of paper submissions and attendance.
- Length of the workshop (half-day/full-day) and the expected number of participants.
- Follow-up plans (if any) to disseminate the ideas from the workshop, for example through position papers or journal special issues.

Requirements for tutorial proposals

Please submit a PDF file including the following information:

- Title of the tutorial.
- Abstract (max. 500 words) describing motivation, intended audience, and main contents.
- List of organizers and speakers including their short biographies and affiliation.
- List of topics to be covered.
- Length and format of the tutorial (lecture, hands-on), and any special technical requirements for the tutorial (and room requirements in case the conference is held physical).
- If the tutorial has been previously offered, provide information on the conference, date, and number of attendees.

Please, send your proposals by email **to both** the FPL 2021 Workshop and Tutorial Chairs with subject: "FPL2021 [Workshop|Tutorial] proposal". A confirmation email for receiving your proposal should be sent within 48-hours. Contact the Workshop and Tutorial Chairs otherwise.

About FPL

The International Conference on Field-Programmable Logic and Applications (FPL) was the first and remains the largest conference covering the rapidly growing area of field-programmable logic, reconfigurable computing and applications. The conference continues to bring together researchers and practitioners from both academia and industry from around the world. Many of the advances in reconfigurable system architectures, applications, embedded processing, design automation methods and tools have been first published in the proceedings of the FPL conference series.

This year, the 31st edition of FPL will be celebrated in Dresden, Germany. The main conference will take place from September 1 until September 3, 2021. FPL 2021 is currently planned as a physical event. However, we closely monitor the situation and we will move to a virtual event if the state of the pandemic does not improve.
